


Christians have always believed that there is hope in death as in life, and that there is renewed life, in Christ, after death.

Hymn in Procession

Sine Nomine

All continue standing while the celebrant says the following:

I am the resurrection and the life, saith the Lord;
he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live;
and whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die.

I know that my Redeemer liveth,
and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth;
and though this body be destroyed, yet shall I see God;
whom I shall see for myself and mine eyes shall behold,
and not as a stranger.

For none of us liveth to himself,
and no man dieth to himself.
For if we live, we live unto the Lord.
and if we die, we die unto the Lord.
Whether we live, therefore, or die, we are the Lord's.

Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord;
even so saith the Spirit, for they rest from their labors.

The people remain standing, as they are able. The leader says

Leader: Let us pray for the Church and for the world.

Grant, Almighty God, that all who confess your name may be united in your truth, live together in your love, and reveal your glory in the world. We pray to the Lord,

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Guide the people of this land, and of all the nations, in the ways of justice and peace; that we may honor one another and serve thy common good. We pray to the Lord,

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Give us all a reverence for the earth as your own creation, that we may use its resources rightly in the service of others and to your honor and glory. We pray to the Lord,

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Bless all of our friends and family that are with us in person and spirit, and those whose lives are closely linked to ours, and grant that we may serve Christ in them, and love one another as he loves us. We pray to the Lord,

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Comfort and heal all those who suffer in body, mind or spirit; give them courage and hope in their troubles, and bring them the joy of your salvation. We pray to the Lord,

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: We commend to your mercy for Don, and all who have died, that your will for them may be fulfilled; and we pray that we may share with all your saints in your eternal kingdom. We pray to the Lord,

People: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Comfort us in our sorrows at the death of one we loved so deeply; let our faith be our consolation, and eternal life our hope. Great God of all that is, we pray to you for Don and for all those whom we love but see no longer. Grant to them eternal rest. Let light perpetual shine upon them. May his soul and the souls of all the departed, through your mercy, rest in peace. **Amen.**

THE COMMENDATION

The people remain standing, as they are able. The Officiant and other ministers take their places at the urn.

Officiant Give rest, O Christ, to thy servant with thy saints,

People **where sorrow and pain are no more,
neither sighing, but life everlasting.**

Officiant Thou only art immortal, the creator and maker of mankind; and we are mortal, formed of the earth, and unto earth shall we return. For so thou didst ordain when thou createdst me, saying,

“Dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.” All we go down to the dust; yet even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

People

**Give rest, O Christ, to your servant with your saints,
where sorrow and pain are no more,
neither sighing, but life everlasting.**

The Officiant then says

Into thy hands, O merciful Savior, we commend thy servant Donald. Acknowledge, we humbly beseech thee, a sheep of thine own fold, a lamb of thine own flock, a sinner of thine own redeeming. Receive him into the arms of thy mercy, into the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light. **Amen.**



Donald Charles Dewey

September 25, 1931 - October 7, 2024

Donald Charles Dewey, long-time resident of San Marino, passed away peacefully on Monday, October 7, 2024. Born on September 25, 1931, Don spent 93 wonderful years living life and devoting himself to his family and friends.

Don was the son of Mrs. Florence Mantz Dewey and Dr. Edward Bradley Dewey formerly of San Marino and Pebble Beach. As a Southern California native born at Pasadena's Huntington Memorial Hospital, he spent his childhood in San Marino and was a 1949 graduate of South Pasadena / San Marino High School. Always willing to serve, Don joined the Navy where he spent

three years in support of the Korean War. Upon returning, he attended UCLA where he was a member of Phi Delta Theta fraternity and met the love of his life and wife of 66 years, Lorraine Belton Dewey. Don graduated with an Economics degree from UCLA in 1957 and had a long and fruitful career in the insurance industry. Don and Lorraine raised their family in San Marino where they stayed until his retirement.

Don was a warm and gracious man, active in the Episcopal church and other community organizations. He was a volunteer with the Pasadena Tournament of Roses since 1973, a loyal member in the Order of Freemasons, and actively involved in the San Marino City Club, along with numerous other clubs and social groups. As a devoted UCLA Bruin and LA Dodger fan, Don rarely missed a game. He was an avid tennis player and golfer, who loved the great outdoors.

Don is survived by his wife Lorraine Belton Dewey, their three children, Elizabeth Champion (Kyle), Catherine Abboud (Omar), and John Dewey (Darcy), six grandchildren whom he adored: David Champion (Justine), Brian Champion (Cosette), Jeffrey Abboud, Michael Abboud (Chinmayi), Kendall Dewey and Caden Dewey, and four great-grandchildren. He is also survived by his two brothers Edward Bradley Dewey, Jr. of Orinda, California and Captain John Dewey (Sandra) of Chevy Chase, Maryland.

As a father of three, Don was actively involved in his children's academics and activities, serving as a role model, counselor, and nurturing dad. His commitment to hard work, ethics, perseverance and integrity were the foundation for how he conducted himself throughout his life and how he raised his children.

A true gentleman, Don treated every human with great respect. He was filled with curiosity and a love for learning and was always eager to thoughtfully engage on any topic. Don's enthusiasm for life, family and friends will be greatly missed by all.
